



COVID-19 VACCINATION POLICY - Volunteers For Clinics, Screenings or Vision Centers And Patient Facing Events

Purpose

At OneSight, we believe we have a responsibility to provide a safe and healthy experience for our patients, volunteers, and employees at all of our clinics, screenings or vision centers and other patient facing events. We are adopting this policy to safeguard the health of our patients, volunteers, and employees, as well as the community at large, and to reduce potential exposure to COVID-19 and associated variants during participation at OneSight clinics, screenings, or vision centers, which may be reduced by the COVID-19 vaccinations. This policy will comply with all applicable laws and is based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local health authorities, as applicable.

Scope

All volunteers participating in a OneSight clinic, screening or vision center are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Those who are not vaccinated will not be allowed to participate in clinics, screenings, or vision centers. The requirement is to have proof of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 before attending any OneSight clinic, screening, or vision center.

Procedures

This Policy serves as notification that all OneSight clinic volunteers are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 prior to attending a OneSight clinic, screening, or vision center, effective November 1, 2021.

Any volunteer who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the 14-days leading up to a clinic, screening or vision center event, or any volunteer who will be attending a clinic, screening or vision center who has had direct exposure to someone positive with COVID-19 within the 14 days prior to the event, should take the following precautions:

- Do not attend any event until they receive a negative test result.
- They should isolate if they test positive.
- If exposed to COVID-19, be tested 3-5 days following the date of their exposure.
